The invention relates to a power tool, especially a drill, hammer or impact driver, that includes a drive transmitting shaft, a chuck connected to the shaft and rotatable therewith, a housing having a front wall and a clamping shoulder, and a chuck cover which is connected to the front wall and has a guide wall that is in screw connection with the chuck. In tools of this type, the guide wall is screwed into a guide groove that is formed in the chuck in a radial and axial direction. The guide groove can be located on the chuck cover or on the housing wall. A friction fit is generally provided between the guide wall and the guide groove. Depending on the configuration of the chuck cover, it is difficult, in some cases, to achieve a reliable retention of the chuck cover on the housing. Especially, when large drill motors are clamped, gaps remain between the guide wall and the guide groove. These gaps prevent a secure retaining of the chuck cover, so that, when the tool is in operation, this may result in an unsymmetrical torque transmission from the chuck to the shaft. Furthermore, in the case of a loose connection of the guide wall with the chuck, the guide wall is not held firmly on the housing in all the cases of application. In the case of a loose connection, there is a possibility that the guide wall will be completely detached from the chuck.
